Reading: 1 John 5:1-12

Faith in the Incarnate Son of God

5 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone who loves the father loves his child as well. ²This is how we know that we love the children of God: by loving God and carrying out his commands. ³In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands. And his commands are not burdensome, ⁴for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. ⁵Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

⁶This is the one who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ. He did not come by water only, but by water and blood. And it is the Spirit who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷For there are three that testify: ⁸the Spirit, the water and the blood; and the three are in agreement. ⁹We accept human testimony, but God's testimony is greater because it is the testimony of God, which he has given about his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God accepts this testimony. Whoever does not believe God has made him out to be a liar, because they have not believed the testimony God has given about his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, we thank you for your word, thank you for challenging us during these times, but also leading the way and helping us understand how to walk with you every day. Amen

Talk by Mike Norris – A Hopeful Family

It's great to be 'with' you today and I hope you're keeping well in these strange times. I don't know about you, but I've found that not everything is bad! I've really got into walking and gone for a long walk each day, which I've really loved. It's a habit that I hope will continue with me after lockdown.

We're continuing our series on the Big Family, focussing today on how we can be a Hopeful family. John says, if you want to be a hopeful individually and also as a church family, we need to "walk" in a particular way.

1. If you want to be hopeful, Walk in love (1-3)

One of John's core themes is love. God is love and as we have seen, God is a loving father and when we come to faith, we become one of his children and join his family.

He reminds us that when we come to faith in Jesus – is it such a radical thing to do – that we are born again into God's family,

'5 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God...'

As people in God's family we are called to love our heavenly Father who loves us, and we are also called to love Jesus too,

'5 and everyone who loves the father loves his child as well. '

We are also called to love one another (fellow "children of God"). How is that going? How are your relationships at this time? It begs the question: How do you love God and love others?. We love God by obeying his commands,

In fact, obeying his commands is the acid test of our love for God,

^{'3} In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands.'

All this talk of God's commands can sound heavy. I am not sure we like all of this talk of obedience. It sounds heavy, authoritarian, a bit crushing, joyless. We assume commands are a bad thing, but they are not. We are getting a puppy and I've been reading up all about it. There is a need to train a dog so that it obeys some basic commands, stop, sit, come back etc. The author of the book is not authoritarian, but there is a need to do this for sake of the family, the house and ultimately for the sake of dog. If it runs off and does not listen or obey commands, there is a high risk of the dog getting lost or run over. A well-trained dog is safe and finds life and life to the full.

Obeying God is how we love God, but it is also how we find life and life to the full and live a significant and fruitful life. And his commands are not burdensome. I think we can often have the feeling that our faith is a pressure, or we are not doing this well, or our prayer life is terrible. We aren't reading our bible enough, we are struggling with behaviour in our own lives. We can end up feeling like our faith is burdensome.

We must remember Jesus' words which John would have heard and which echo in what John is writing,

²⁸ "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.³⁰ For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Mt 11:28-30

So, we are to walk in love – obeying Gods commands thereby finding his life. When we do this, we live in hope.

2. John says, if you want to be hopeful walk in victory (4-5)

⁴ for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has **overcome** the world, even our faith. ⁵ Who is it that **overcomes the world**? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God. (

John speaks of two aspects of victory. One, our initial turning away from the world to Jesus (the reference to "has overcome") and second, to the continuing day to day victory of Christians living (the reference to "overcomes"). How are you feeling about walking in victory? When I hear that phrase it makes me think of a medal or this song:

Be Bold, Be Strong For The Lord Your God Is With You Be Bold, Be Strong For The Lord Your God Is With You I Am Not Afraid, I Am Not Dismayed Because I'm Walking In Faith And Victory Come On And Walk In Faith And Victory For The Lord Your God Is With You [2]

Are you feeling like you are walking in victory? This is a key theme in bible teaching, for example,

'But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.' 1 Corinthians 15:57

To be honest I have not spoken to many people in these pandemic times who are thinking that we are walking in victory. People I speak to are feeling tired, zoomed out, and struggling with the present climate of easing restrictions but also a lack of certainty around what is permitted and what isn't permitted. What are responsible choices to be making at this time and what are irresponsible choices?

The vibe seems to be relief that there is an easing but also great confusion and uncertainty too. It is undoubtedly stressful. John knows what it is like to live under pressure. He's watched his closest friend be tortured and die. He knows what it is like to face persecution and he writes about being an overcomer. We need to challenge any cynicism or bitterness. We are victorious, in Christ our past, present and future have changed. God is amazing.

How can we walk in victory?

• Walk with authenticity

Be honest with God about how you are doing and be yourself and real. We don't have to fake it when we follow Jesus. We don't have to always be fine and hide what is happening. Just look at the psalms.

- Walk with others just as Jesus did PODs, triplets, and smaller groups been a place where people have flourished in the lockdown.
- Walk for others just as Jesus did Do two things for someone else each day and don't tell about them it.
- Walk in reality

Own the fact that walking in victory does not mean that you have problems or that you will have a suffering free life. In the midst of the trials, look to Jesus who is the victorious one and is seeking to lead you in victory.

3. If you want to be hopeful walk with the Spirit (6-9)

^{'6} This is the one who came by water and blood —Jesus Christ. He did not come by water only, but by water and blood. '

What John is doing here is challenging the wrong teaching of some of those in the community to whom John is writing. Some wrongly taught that God descended on Jesus at his baptisms but left him before his suffering on the cross, so that it was only Jesus the man who died. So, John is challenging this and saying that Jesus was fully human and fully God at his birth, baptism and death. This of course is important as his work on the cross depended on him being fully human.

'And it is the Spirit who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷ For there are three that testify: ⁸ the Spirit, the water and the blood; and the three are in agreement. ⁹

We are called to walk with the Spirit and to keep in step with the Spirit. It is essential to our spiritual wellbeing. I was out walking the other day when it was hot. I drank a pint of water before I left and thought I would be fine for a couple of hours. Soon, I got quite dehydrated and started to feel tired. I have less energy, started to get a headache and my muscles were aching. The walk was not fun, became a chore and I just wanted to get back home. Without physical water, I became quickly dehydrated and felt the effects of this. The same happens spiritually. We need to be people who walk in the Spirit. God Himself will lead us as we draw closely to His Spirit.

How do we walk in the Spirit?

- Acknowledge Him
- Welcome Him in your life
- Speak to Him
- Ask Him to fill you afresh each day
- Ask Him to lead you and guide you
- To strengthen, encourage and comfort you
- Ask Him to speak to you
- Drink His water moment by moment, day by day

As Christians we have this whole different present and future going on which was won for us through Jesus on the cross.
